Hello Mums, Dads and Carers

There is lots of news to share as Anne and I start to become more familiar with the nursery. The children are settled now and enjoying playing alongside each other and with their older peers. One of the benefits of the mixed age classes is how the younger children look up to and learn from their older friends. We also notice the care and concern the older children have for the younger children, showing them where to find things, sharing their skills and helping if they need it.

Did you know we are a Maintained Nursery School? Balham

Nursery School is part of the Wandsworth Federation for Maintained Nursery Schools (MNS). What makes us different to other nurseries? We are a local authority school and our funding is controlled by the Local Authority. Nursery schools were set up over a century ago to provide early education and care to balance health and wellbeing with education. Although an early education provider we are legally constituted as a school. Like maintained schools we have a Head teacher/Deputy, a governing body, delegated budget and at least one teacher with qualified teacher status (QTS) and a qualified QTS teacher as SENCo (Special Educational Needs Coordinator). MNS are viewed as centres of excellence and their role is often see wider than just delivering early years' provision. This might include how we value the voice of the child, the use of outdoors, and support for children with SEND plus other models for good practice. This year at Balham we are supporting Kings College students in a Gender Action Project and take opportunities to engage in research whenever we can.

Chatterbox We have had some wonderful responses from you and your child regarding the Chatterbox experience. This has provided a rich time for children to share items from home that are important to them. The children have felt greatly valued and we have learned more about them as they 'chatter' about their selected toys with an adult and some peers. Keep sending your chatterboxes in!

Diwali This month we celebrated Diwali, the Hindu festival of light
